This month I am going to highlight some books that might fly under your radar but have received a lot of pre-publication buzz and great reviews. *Party of Liars* by Kelsey Cox (July 1): "a lavish, Texas-sized Sweet Sixteen turns deadly in this twisty, pulse-pounding new novel — serving up a fresh take on a classic locked-room whodunnit." *The Lighthouse at the Edge of the World* by J.R. Dawson (July 29): "At the edge of Chicago...there is a waystation for the dead. Every night, the newly-departed travel through the city to the Station, guided by its lighthouse. There, they reckon with their lives, before stepping aboard a boat to go beyond." *The Lies They Told* by Ellen Marie Wiseman (July 29): In rural 1930s Virginia, a young immigrant mother fights for her dignity and those she loves against America's rising eugenics movement...in this tragic and uplifting novel of social injustice, survival, and hope." *Last Stop Union Station* by Sarah James (July 15): "Murder, movie stars, and mystery await those who climb aboard this cross-country train, inspired by the real-life history of the Hollywood Victory Caravan." 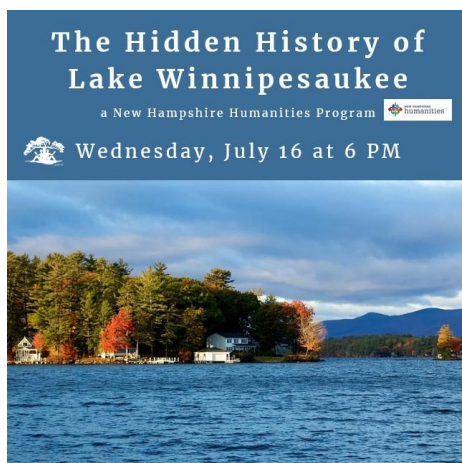

### Armchair Travel to Mongolia

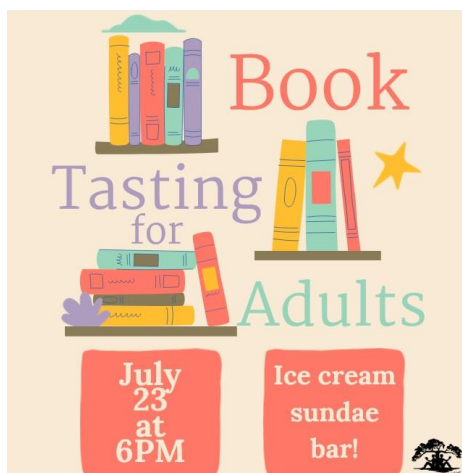
Professional traveler Chris McCormack joins us virtually via Zoom on Tuesday, July 8 at 2:00 p.m. to talk about his 6-week motorcycle trip across Mongolia. Come learn about this fascinating country with many different landscapes and an ancient nomadic culture. Chris's travels included a visit to one of the last reindeer herders in the world, a demonstration from the Eagle Hunters of Western Mongolia, and a journey through the Gobi Desert. His stories, accompanied with his photos, will leave you amazed! This program will also be shown in person at the library at the same time. No registration required to join us in person. ### Hidden History of Lake Winnepesaukee

Thought you knew all there was to know about New Hampshire's "Big Lake"? Think again! Lake Winnepesaukee's history goes well beyond the boating and other recreational-related activities we think of



today, and on Wednesday, July 16 at 6:00 p.m., Glenn Knoblock will dive into that history. Glenn will discuss the real story of “America’s Oldest Summer Resort” in Wolfeboro, the religious sect on Gilford’s Governors Island who thought the world was ending, Massachusetts’ early efforts to claim New Hampshire territory as their own, the site of the country’s first college sports rivalry in Center Harbor, the Black community that once existed in Gilmanton, and the only airport of its kind in the entire country in Alton. Whether you live in the area or are a visitor from elsewhere, these fascinating and enlightening bits of history will change forever how you view our “Big Lake.” This program is made possible with a grant from New Hampshire Humanities.

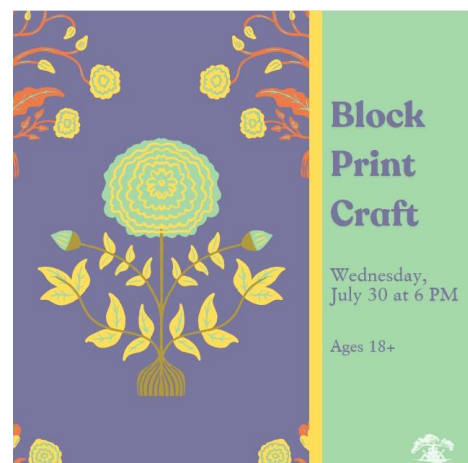
## Evening DIY Tie Dye

Thought to have originated in China more than 2,000 years ago, block printing is the earliest method of printing on paper with the oldest dated printed book still in existence, the *Diamond Sutra*, printed in the year 868. On Wednesday, July 30 at 6:00 p.m. we will be trying our hand in this ancient craft. Local artist Tif Farmakis-Day will be instructing us, and all supplies will be provided. Just bring your ideas! There are limited spots for this class, so register early.

## Eyes on Owls

**Potential Impact of Executive Order Reducing the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) on Nesmith Services.**

### June 20, 2025 Update:

The New Hampshire State Library has received official award notification for the full and anticipated amount of Grants to States Funds through IMLS. This provides for federally funded ser-

vices through September 30, 2026.

The defunding and elimination of IMLS currently remains in the Federal Budget proposal, so this may be a temporary reprieve. I will continue to follow the news about how these changes could affect library service in New Hampshire and here locally in Windham.

Complete all the challenges and bring your fin-

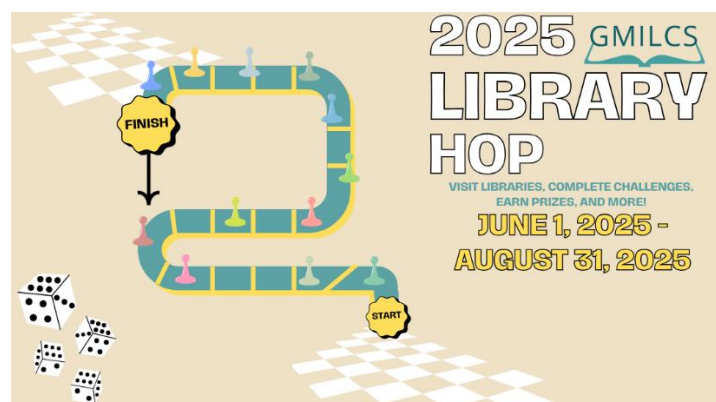
ished game board back to Nesmith Library to be entered into a raffle for a \$100 gift card to The Bookery in Manchester, N.H.
