
Nesmith Library Book Group

breviations that not only tell us more about our ancestors, but also about their place in time. To find out more about these gravestone etchings, join us on Thursday, June 22 at 6:00 PM when Erin E. Moulton presents "A Beginner's Guide to Cemetery Sleuthing." A local genealogist and librarian, Erin will cover strategies to help locate your ancestor's burial place, discuss how to make the most out of a visit, and teach us how to decipher a variety of symbols. The presentation also includes a list of Erin's favorite cemetery resources. Most of the presentation covers New England cemeteries, though many symbols can be seen nationwide. We are pleased to cohost this in-person program with the Windham Historical Society.



Erin E. Moulton writes books and tracks dead people. As a genealogist, slipping into old records and exploring past lives is something she has done for herself and for others for over 14 years. Erin is a member of the Association of Professional Genealogists, the New Hampshire Historical Society, the New Hampshire Society of Genealogists, and more. She serves on the landmark committee for the Black Heritage Trail of New Hampshire and is a part-time reference librarian at the Derry Public Library.

George Tooker: Modern Life and Magical Realism



George Tooker often depicted the tensions of modern life and in-

human bureaucracies in his art. As a gay man who was active in the Civil Rights movement, Tooker explored boundary-breaking subjects in his work while also conjuring powerful scenes of quiet beauty. On Thursday, June 29 at 7:00 p.m., join Nesmith Library in conjunction with other GMILCS libraries for the third event in our Art Series with Jane Oneail, "George Tooker: Modern Life and Magical Realism." This virtual Zoom program introduces the artist, his life, and his remarkable body of work.

Jane Oneail is an independent scholar and holds a master's degree in Art History from Boston University and a master's degree in Art in Education from Harvard University. Jane is a New Hampshire native and has worked at some of the state's most esteemed cultural institutions including the League of New Hampshire Craftsmen, where she served as executive director. and the Currier Museum of Art. where she held the role of senior educator. Jane has also taught at the college level for more than a decade, most recently at the N.H. Institute of Art. And later that day, to ensure you're also set for any questions


you have about future school plans, we have "Navigating College Admissions in 2023" with Nancy Steenson on June 6 at 6:30 p.m.
