


Nesmith Library Book Group

Can I Get You a Drink? Stories of Female Poisoners


You are cordially invited to register for a one-of-a-kind virtual cocktail hour! "Can I Get You A Drink? Stories of Female Poisoners" is taking place on Zoom on Wednesday, March 8 at 6:00 p.m. Presenter and investigator, Erin E.

Moulton, will email five drink recipes to those who have registered, and you can choose to make a beverage at home (hold the arsenic!) to enjoy during this virtual Zoom presentation. Non-alcoholic options are available. While we sip, Erin will bring us through historical records and weave together the lives of five female poisoners, and we'll find out whose story matches each of the beverage recipes. Was it murder or misunderstanding? You decide!



Erin E. Moulton writes books and tracks dead people. As a genealogist, slipping into old records and exploring past lives is something she has done for herself and for others for over 14 years. Erin is a member of the Association of Professional Genealogists. the New Hampshire Historical Society, the New Hampshire Society of Genealogists, and more. She serves on the landmark committee for the Black Heritage Trail of New Hampshire and is a part-time reference librarian at the Derry Public Library. From Tribe to Nation: A Musical Journey Through the History of Ireland



On Monday, March 13 at 6:00 p.m. Irish humorist and folksinger Tom O'Carroll will visit us to share "From Tribe to Nation: A Musical Journey Through the History of Ireland." This presentation traces the history of the Irish people from the Stone Age to the present. Drawing on archaeological data, historical records, as well as music and song. Tom explores the broad social and cultural themes of conflict and identity that occur through the island's history. Throughout his presentation, Tom performs various songs, tunes, and little known anecdotes that bring to life the story of the Irish. Refreshments will be served.

Dublin-born folklorist, folk-singer, and instrumentalist Tom O'Carroll brings a wealth of stories, humor, wit, and history to his performances. He has played at concerts, festivals, colleges, libraries, and pubs all over the U.S. and Canada, as well as his native Ireland, including a stint for one month in Seoul, South Korea. Whether playing a plaintive air on the tin whistle, or singing and playing rousing traditional songs to the accompaniment of the guitar or

It's almost time to set our clocks forward. You might say time is really Marching on. With the extra sunlight we'll be getting, we'll be having a lot of delightful new programs!


