Pairing Tea with Chocolate

Chocolate and tea?? We'll definitely need some expert insight to successfully pair those two. "Pairing Tea with Chocolate" is a combination program of a kit available for pick up starting Tuesday, May 9 for those who register, and a virtual Zoom presentation on Thursday, May 11 at 6:00 p.m. The virtual interactive lecture with certified Tea Specialist Danielle Beaudette of The Cozy Tea Cart in Brookline, N.H., will start with a brief back-

ground on the production of the cocoa bean and the tea plant, highlighting their similarities. Danielle will teach us how to properly taste chocolate, and we will finish by sampling five different teas paired with chocolate ranging from 35% to 85% cocoa, that are provided in the kit that registrants picked up starting Tuesday, May 9. You must be a Nesmith Library card holder to register, and space and kits are limited.



Danielle Beaudette is the owner of The Cozy Tea Cart and is one of the first 15 individuals in the world to be certified as a Tea Specialist through the Specialty Tea Institute, N.Y. She has researched and learned first-hand about the production of tea through her Asian tea travels. Her tea shop sells only the finest, high quality, freshly imported teas, and has earned the title of "Best of N.H." from New Hampshire Magazine. Since opening her shop, Danielle has been dedicated to educating her customers. The invaluable information she has received from her travels to the tea estates in Asian countries, from attending World Tea Expo seminars, and from the Specialty Tea Institute certified educational programs has provided her with insights on the current trends of the tea industry and advanced awareness of the latest studies on the health benefits of tea.

Culturally Curious Art Series: Revolutionary Design



New England is known for its history and traditions, but it is also home to some daring and inventive modern designs from some of the world's leading architects. On Thursday, May 25 at 7:00 p.m., join Nesmith Library in conjunction with other GMILCS libraries for the second event, "Revolutionary Design: Modern Architecture in New England," in our art series with Jane Oneail. In this virtual Zoom presentation, we will discover how giants in the field like Frank Lloyd Wright, Walter Gropius, Louis Kahn, Philip Johnson, and Maya Lin combine the expected and the familiar with the innovative and experimental. This program will introduce us to each architect and walk us through their notable works in New England locales.

Jane Oneail is an independent scholar and holds a master's degree in Art History from Boston University and a master's degree in

Art in Education from Harvard University. Jane is a New Hampshire native and has worked at some of the state's most esteemed cultural institutions, including the League of New Hampshire Craftsmen, where she served as executive director, and the Currier Museum of Art, where she held the role of senior

educator. Jane has also taught at the college level for more than a decade, most recently at the N.H. Institute of Art. Find out more about Jane, and her art programs, on her website: iamculturallycurious.com.


