On Tuesday, May 6 at 1:00 p.m., we will welcome consumer law professionals from 603 Legal Aid to discuss the growing risks of fraud and identity theft, focusing on how personal information is stolen and misused by criminals. They will teach us how to identify red flags, secure sensitive information, and respond to potential threats. Don't miss this chance to learn how to protect yourself from consumer fraud.
