

Join us on Thursday, Oct. 12 at 6:00 p.m. when we welcome author Jeff Romano for a presentation highlighting hiking locations throughout New England. The program will cover destinations in all 6 states with a focus on itineraries featured in his latest guidebook, an updated edition to 100 Classic Hikes New England (June 2023.) Jeff will share advice, provide insights, and answer questions on how and where to plan your next hiking adventure. The presentation will also include information on New England wildflowers, birds, wildlife, history, and conservation success stories.

Jeff Romano is a lifelong New England resident who has been hiking for 5 decades. He is the author of 4 other guidebooks: *Hike the Park Acadia* (2021,) *Day Hiking New England* (2015,) *100 Classic Hikes New England, First Edition* (2010,) and *Best Loop Hikes: New Hampshire's White Mountains to the Maine Coast* (2006.) Published by Mountaineers Books, these books will be available for sale after the presentation. Jeff has also written numerous outdoor articles for the *Boston Globe* and other publications. When not hiking, Jeff directs public policy activities for Maine Coast Heritage Trust, a land trust that conserves and stewards Maine's coastal lands and islands. He lives in Hallowell, Maine, with his wife, and shares his passion for the outdoors with his family, including his 2 adult children.

More Haunted Lighthouses of New England



Lighthouses and ghost stories often seem to go hand in hand, and this is the perfect season to dive into some of them! On Monday, Oct. 16 at 7:00 p.m., Jeremy D'Entremont will join us virtually via Zoom to tell us about the mysterious Woman in White in the Isles of Shoals and the spirit of a drowned lighthouse keeper at Penfield Reef in Connecticut, as well as some of the paranormal investigations he's been part of – and much more. This program is presented in conjunction with Ashland Public Library in Ashland, Mass.

Jeremy D'Entremont is the president and historian of the American Lighthouse Foundation, historian for the U.S. Lighthouse Society, and the author of more than 20 books and hundreds of articles on lighthouses and maritime history. He's the producer and host of the U.S. Lighthouse Society's podcast, Light Hearted. He has appeared on the popular Ghost Hunters TV show, as well as Haunted Lighthouses of America on the Travel Channel. He has also appeared on the History Channel, Public Television, and National Public Radio speaking about lighthouses.

The Capital Crime of Witchcraft



The witchcraft trials of the Colonial era may seem to have been nothing but a free-for-all, fraught with hysterics, but on Tuesday, Oct. 17 at 6:00 p.m., Margo Burns will set the record straight. Margo will explore an array of prosecutions in seventeenth century New England, using facsimiles of primary source manuscripts, from first formal complaints to arrest warrants. indictments of formal charges to death warrants, and the reversals of attainder and rescinding of excommunications years after the fact; demonstrating how methodically and logically the Salem Court worked. This program focuses on the Salem witchcraft trials of 1692 and 1693, when 19 people were hanged and one crushed to death, but also examines a variety of other cases against women in New Hampshire, Massachusetts, and Connecticut, We are pleased to co-host this New Hampshire Humanities program with the Windham Historical Society.

Margo Burns is the 10thgeneration great-granddaughter of Rebecca Nurse, who was hanged in Salem in 1692 on the charge of witchcraft. She is the project manager and an associate editor of *Records of the*

Salem Witch-Hunt, published in 2009 by Cambridge University Press. This work is the definitive collection of transcriptions of the legal records of the episode. Burns is also a life-long fan of cartoons, cutting her teeth on Popeye and Yogi Bear on Saturday mornings as a child, then formally studying animation for two years in the Rhode Island School of Design's Continuing Education Program as an adult. She has been leading computer animation projects with middle and high school students since 2001 at UNH's Tech Camp in Durham, where each crew makes a complete film in a week. Burns recently retired from St. Paul's School, as the director of The Lanquage Center, where she was also the adviser to a student club, the International Lunchtime Animation Festival (iLAF), which tapped her personal library of animation of over 750 titles.

> Celebrating 100 Years of the Red Arrow Diner



Not many restaurants make it 100 vears, but Manchester, New Hampshire's Red Arrow Diner has kept the comfort in comfort food for the last century. On Wednesday, Oct. 18 at 6:00 p.m., Mike Morin will share some of the history of the Red Arrow along with many of the stories that tie to unexpected people and organizations. There is an early Rockefeller connection, and today's fans include local guy Adam Sandler, a Red Arrow regular. Also spotted at the counter and in the booths, celebs from Kevin Costner to RuPaul to Barenaked Ladies, and of course, nearly every presidential hopeful for the past 40 years. Quirky and adorable, the Red Arrow is the heartbeat of downtown Manchester. We are pleased to be co-hosting this program with the Windham Historical Society.

Raised in Detroit, author and radio personality Mike Morin discovered candlepins later in life and quickly became interested in the stars whose stories made the game so compelling. A retired radio host and candlepin TV broadcaster, Mike continues to bowl candlepins in New Hampshire, where he lives with Barbara and their dog, Basia.




