Our New Online Catalog Is Active!



All of the GMILCS (Greater Manchester Integrated Library Cooperative System) libraries, including the Nesmith Library, have transitioned their catalogs. We are excited about the new catalog!

This change means our catalogs sport a new, modern design, and the ability to find what you're looking for more quickly and easily.

Start Here

Go to <u>discover.nesmithlibrary.org</u> to check out the new catalog. If you are not sure where to start, we have set up a page to help out: <u>discover.nesmithlibary.org/new</u>.

Biggest Changes

There are some big changes between the old catalog and new.

Home Page: The catalog home page now sports a display of book covers and other helpful, frequently updated lists, so you can see new items at the library, the New York Times best seller lists, and more! You can also view your lists and saved searches to the front page to locate them easily when logged in to your account. ➤ Search Results: Another big change is how search results are displayed. Previously, every type of item displayed as an individual result. If we had a book, large print book, audiobook on CD, and an eBook of a title, they all returned as individual entries and you might have to scroll for awhile to find the one you wanted. Now, it's all together!

Frequently Asked Questions Why did you change the catalog?

Just like how sometimes your house needs a big upgrade or change, so do websites. The new catalog layout is more than just new siding on the house. We also chose a product that gave us improved framing and updated insulation. In short, our library catalog was in need of some major renovation. The product we're using was chosen for it's ease of use, it's functionality, and it's ability to be customized. This new user-friendly catalog is designed to make it easier than ever to find and borrow materials from Nesmith Library and other **GMILCS libraries!**

Culturally Curious Art Series: Abstract Expressionism



Jackson Pollock is the famous originator of the drip and splatter paintings that came to epitomize Abstract Expressionism at the middle of the twentieth century. Pollock served as the de facto leader of the movement, a masculine cowboy

representing "action painting." Only in recent years has the art world turned its attention to the contributions of women artists working at the same time, including Lee Krasner, Jackson Pollock's wife. On Thursday, September 21 at 7:00 p.m., join the Nesmith Library in conjunction with other GMILCS libraries for the sixth and final event in our Culturally Curious Art Series with Jane Oneail, featuring Jackson Pollock, Lee Krasner, and Abstract Expressionism. This virtual Zoom program explores the relationships of the artists, their work, and the enduring legacy in this revolutionary movement.

Jane Oneail is an independent scholar and holds a master's degree in Art History from Boston University and a master's degree in Art in Education from Harvard University. Jane is a New Hampshire native and has worked at some of the state's most esteemed cultural institutions, including the League of New Hampshire Craftsmen, where she served as executive director, and the Currier Museum of Art, where she held the role of senior educator. Jane has also taught at the college level for more than a decade, most recently at the NH Institute of Art. Find out more about Jane, and her art programs, on her website: iamculturallycurious.com.


